5. I was very disappointed. I really wanted to take my LSAT preparation course with TestMasters. I then decided that I would take my preparation course with Kaplan, even though I really wanted to take it with the California based TestMasters. I went on the yahoo search page and typed in LSAT Test Preparation. When I did this, the second listing on the page said "TestMasters LSAT Preparation: TestMasters offers an 80-hour full-length LSAT course, 16-hour weekend, private LSAT tutoring, and law school admissions consulting at locations worldwide," at the bottom of this message it gave the correct web address for the California TestMasters, www.testmasters180.com.
6. I then I clicked on the icon and was brought to the website. I was still unaware that this website belong to a different TestMasters, although I did notice that this website gave more information on their LSAT preparation courses than www.testmasters.com. I clicked on an icon at the bottom of the page that said online request form. I filled out the information as requested and emailed it to TestMasters' email address.
7. A few days later I received information about TestMasters through the mail. The packet contained the phone number to the Los Angeles office of TestMasters. I called the number from the packet and spoke to an enrollment advisor. I told her about my experience in going to www.testmasters.com. She informed me that the website I went to belonged to a company with the same name that operated out of Texas.
8. The whole experience was very upsetting and disappointing. Had I not received the packet from TestMasters, I would have never known of this deception. I would have been forced to take a LSAT preparation course with a company I knew was not as good as TestMasters.
