

## DECLARATION OF ROBIN ROSEN

I, Robin Rosen, declare:

1. I am the mother of Chelsea Rosen.
2. On May 3rd, 2005, I phoned Testmasters in order to register my daughter into their LSAT class in New York City after learning of Testmasters from a student and the parent of a student who completed the Testmasters LSAT course the previous year. The names of the students are Brett Pearlman and Ingrid Lebenger.
3. I phoned 1-800-910-3926 after typing in testmasters on a google search and highlighting a Testmasters web site. I called on behalf of my daughter who was currently finishing a semester in London. I spoke with Angela about all the options for their LSAT courses that were to be offered during the summer in New York, and St. Louis.
4. She was not very knowledgeable and suggested I phone back later when another employee might be better informed to address my questions. Over the next two days I finally was able to speak to a woman, Anu John, who I was told would be able to address all my concerns regarding taking the course in two different cities. One of the two students who referred me to Testmasters did exactly that. He started in New York and finished in another city. Anu was very vague about whether or not that option was available and suggested that my daughter go to Houston, Texas to take the course or enroll in their private tutoring for about \$7,000. When Anu mentioned Houston I became very confused because I recalled being told that Testmasters was in California.
5. I continued to inquire about their New York dates and locations for this summer and was repeatedly told that the summer schedule will not be available for quite some time, but I could register now and keep checking with their website for the summer dates.
6. I asked to confirm the locations of the classes attended by the two students (I supplied their full names) who took their class last year because I was being told that Testmasters never offered the LSAT course in the locations I mentioned. After looking up the two names in their computer, they told me those names were never registered and I must have the wrong names.
7. I was very confused and nicely asked if there could be another Testmasters. I was told by Anu "I wouldn't know."
8. I phoned Brett Pearlman at Duke Law during his finals and asked for help since he was one of the students who referred me to Testmasters. He e-mailed me the website at which time I noticed it was Testmasters180.com.
9. I recently attended a college graduation party for a family friend's son and had a chance to speak with his siblings and catch up on their lives since they live in Florida and have either graduated college or are attending college now. One sibling is currently in Law School and graduated from the University of

Pennsylvania. I asked what LSAT course she took and she said Testmasters. I was very excited and told her my daughter Chelsea is taking the same course and how fortunate she is to be able to start it in New York and complete it in St. Louis. I asked if she did the same with Florida and Pennsylvania. She said no, since she had taken a year off after graduation and only needed to take the course in Florida. She told me they said they were not offering the course in Florida until they had enough students actually registered in Florida and could therefore not make any guarantees. They suggested she fly back and forth from Florida to Houston for their classes, which she ultimately did.

10. I immediately knew that she was talking about the Testmasters in Texas, the "company" that claims to know nothing about the California-based Testmasters, which does offer classes in Florida.
11. I then told her my story with the Texas-based Testmasters and how they tried to fool me into registering my daughter into their LSAT course. She was completely shocked. She couldn't believe she took the wrong Testmasters LSAT prep course.
12. I wonder how many other students and parents have, or almost have fallen victim to this blatant lack of integrity on the part of Testmasters in Houston, Texas.

I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of New York that the foregoing is true and correct, and that this declaration was executed on July 25, 2005 at 33 Hemlock Hills, Chappaqua, New York, 10514.
