

DECLARATION OF WILLIAM PLUNK

I, William Plunk, declare,

1. As a result of my direct involvement in the matters set forth below, I have personal and firsthand knowledge of the facts set forth in this declaration, and I could and would testify competently to such facts if called as a witness, at no expense to myself.
2. In the spring of 2007, I was in my junior year at Shawnee State University in Ohio. It was my intention to go to law school, so I decided to take an LSAT test preparation course.
3. As I searched on the internet for recommendations about which course to take, I read an article about how Robin Singh held the world record for the number of perfect scores on the LSAT. I also learned that he had created an LSAT prep course by the name of TestMasters.
4. Based on Robin's impressive record, I decided to take the TestMasters LSAT prep course he had created.
5. To enroll, I googled "testmasters" and saw two results that appeared viable: www.testmasters.com and www.testmasters180.com. I was confused about why there were two websites.

I quickly visited both of the sites to clear up my confusion and find out which was the company attached to Robin Singh's name, but as a casual user I did not see any blatant mentions of his name upfront on either site. Both sites offered LSAT courses, so I assumed one was Robin's company and was well-established while the other site was probably trying to play off his fame by association.
7. Since www.testmasters.com seemed more legitimate at first glance, thus I opted to use www.testmasters.com.
8. Assuming I was enrolling in Robin Singh's course, I registered on www.testmasters.com for an LSAT prep course set to begin on July 7, 2007, in Columbus, Ohio.
9. In the time leading up to the scheduled start date of the course, I was browsing the internet for more information about the LSAT in general and how other people were faring. In my reading, I came across some discussions about people who had taken a TestMasters LSAT prep course but had not improved their LSAT scores anywhere near what they had expected based on the highly-regarded reputation of the course.
10. The replies to their posts explained to the disappointed students that they had probably taken a fake prep course offered by a scam company operating under the same name of

TestMasters, but offering a sub-par course. The replies also included a link to a news article about the fraudulent TestMasters company, which I clicked to read.

11. The news article confirmed the replies to the discussion and explained that the fraudulent TestMasters was operating the website at www.testmasters.com and the real TestMasters was found at www.testmasters180.com.
12. I went back to the www.testmasters.com website to look again for Robin Singh's name anywhere on the site as the course's creator. I did not find it.
13. Then, I went to www.testmasters180.com and looked for Robin Singh's name. I scrolled to the bottom of the front page and clearly saw Robin Singh's name listed as the creator and writer of the course.
14. Luckily I was contacted by the other TestMasters at www.testmasters.com where they informed me the course had been canceled. After which they proceeded to remind me of the fact that they also offered an online course at www.testmasters.com. I immediately declined this offer.
15. Because of the cancellation with TestMasters at www.testmasters.com, my registration with the TestMasters at www.testmasters180.com was now late because the course that fit my schedule was starting just three days later. Normally, that would mean that I would need to pay a late registration fee.
16. Fortunately, the real TestMasters was kind enough to waive my late registration fee and allow me to register for the course as normal.
17. Moreover, the real TestMasters ensured I had my course materials in time for the first class by shipping them to me as a priority overnight package, which they paid for out of their own funds.
18. Testmasters at www.testmasters180.com helped ensure I was able to get into their course even at such a late notice. Thanks to them I was able to take the LSAT when I needed to, confidently.
